Five papers on Italy honoring Herbert Bloch

The following five papers were offered to Herbert Bloch on the occasion of his acceptance of an honorary life membership in the American Society of Greek and Latin Epigraphy at a special session of the joint meeting of the American Philological Association and the Archaeological Institute of America in December 1998 in Washington, D.C. They are presented here, prefaced by a bibliography of his writings, in his honor and in anticipation of his ninetieth birthday in August 2001. The list of publications may suggest the breadth of erudition but cannot convey the great *humanitas* of a gentleman and scholar whose vicissitudes in early life would have prevented a lesser man from becoming either, nor do they adequately represent the accomplishments of an extraordinary career, for an outline of which see A. Esch's introduction and the biographical note cited at no. 114 below.
